• Options for Tax & Utility Payments:

- Credit Cards & E Checks are <u>only accepted online</u>.
- <u>Online Payments</u>: To review and pay your Taxes & Utility Bills online go to <u>www.mapleshade.com</u>. Look for the" View & Pay your Taxes & Utilities" in the top, blue bar on the home page.
- <u>Bill Pay</u>: This option is done through your bank. When using this option, please identify the property that the payment is intended for.
 <u>Example</u>: Taxes use the Block & Lot and Utilities use the Account Number. Unidentified checks will be mailed back to the address on the check. Please note that "Bill Pay Checks" take at least 7-10 days to reach the Tax Collector's Office.
- <u>Checks & Money Orders</u>: With this option your payment may be mailed or put into the drop box located to the left of the main entrance at the Municipal Building.

3. MAPLE SHADE POLICE DEPARTMENT OFFICER HIGHLIGHT

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER, MISTY WEISS



Officer Misty Weiss was hired by Chief Edmund Vernier and joined the Maple Shade Police Department in August 1999. Misty was the first female police officer in the department's history, a fact celebrated by the agency in our local paper at the time called "The Maple Shade Progress. Misty was well-aware of this and had set out early in her career to make her mark on policing in Maple Shade being selected twice by her peers as the Officer of the Year.

While serving in the patrol division, Misty held several roles including DARE Officer, Certified Bike Officer, Field Training Officer, and Shift Commander. Misty spent much of her time mentoring both new officers as well as the children of Maple Shade. Misty always made time for the kids in the township and that dedication was a hallmark of her career. So when the position of School Resource Officer became available, it was clear to police administrators that Misty would be a natural fit.

As the longest serving School Resource Officer in the department's history, Misty's impact in our school district is undeniable. Misty's caring nature, proven track record, and experience level, as well as her commonsense approach, made her a standout SRO in the County of Burlington. Misty is often used as a resource by other agencies providing guidance and insight regularly with regards to juvenile matters. Because she maintains a close working relationship with the personnel of the Family Court, Misty is able to address concerns about particular cases directly with the individuals who will be processing those cases. This is very beneficial to the juveniles and their caretakers as it allows the Juvenile Justice System to build an individualized plan that best fits the juvenile while supporting the guardians of those juveniles.

Misty was also instrumental in working with Chief Chris Fletcher and the Police Chaplains to establish a youth diversionary program in the township, by offering alternative methods to teach our youth the importance of the cause-and-effect relationship of their decisions, all the while keeping them out of the Juvenile Justice System and redirecting them onto a positive path forward. This work was recognized by the Burlington County Prosecutor's Office and Maple Shade became the fourth township in the county to create a Juvenile Municipal Policy Board with Misty as a co-chair. The board was created to proactively address juvenile issues specific to our community in partnership with the Police Department, School District, and the Township alike.

Additionally, Misty also took the lead for our agency in addressing the problem of hunger in the township. Her resourcefulness, dedication, and determination were on full display during the pandemic as she made certain that no family, she learned of with a food insecurity issue, went without food and her efforts continue to this day. Her partnership with the Maple Shade Food Bank, the School District, and PBA Local #267 is well known and appreciated by everyone at the police department.

Misty will soon celebrate 22 years as a Maple Shade Police Officer and still loves coming to work every day. She was born and raised in Maple Shade and has very, strong ties to the community. When Misty is not fulfilling her role as a law enforcement officer, she enjoys spending time with her husband Brian and their three children. Misty is a devoted mother and wife, a fitness and cooking enthusiast, and loves to travel when time allows.

• <u>Option #1</u> -

- All branches:
 - Must be cut in 4 ft. lengths
 - All branches / brush that are LESS than 2 inches in diameter:

Must be cut in 4 Ft. lengths, tied, and bundled and not weigh more than 40 lbs.
