1. 0% TAX INCREASE IS INTRODUCED BY MAPLE SHADE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL

On April 8th, the Township Manager alongside the Chief Financial Officer presented Town Council with the 2021 Municipal Budget. The municipal budget was introduced with a ZERO municipal tax increase.

The 0% tax increase fulfills the necessary obligations and ensures all services remain intact at the same levels as the residents have become accustomed.

Council is extremely pleased to have been able to introduce a 0% tax increase to its residents and understands how difficult the past year has been on everyone. Our department heads and staff continue to play a tremendous role in ensuring fiscal responsibility and with their efforts we will move forward continuing to improve upon and provide additional services and programs.

The public hearing for the budget will be held on Thursday, May 13, 2021 at the Council meeting.

REDUCED SCHOOL TAXES INTRODUCED BY MAPLE SHADE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Maple Shade School District has been underfunded for many years from the State of New Jersey beginning in 2008 and lasting until 2018. While Maple Shade Schools were growing in population, we never received our equal share of funding. In the last 2 years, we have seen minimal increases of State Aid to reflect our current enrollment.

This year, we received over 3 million dollars which is getting us closer to bridging our financial gap. With this increase, we are able to reduce school taxes for the first time in many years. Our hope is that the funding will continue, and we will be able to continue to educate our children with our fair share of funding from the state.

- #4 - Check air refrigeration & other appliances must be attended for the safety of citizens.
- #5 - Metal can _____ be placed outside for regular trash. Metal may be taken to the Public Works Drop-off.
- #6 - You may place _____ on the curb each week. (Ex: tools can be 10 lbs, steel is 10 lbs)

6. MAPLE SHADE POLICE DEPARTMENT OFFICER HIGHLIGHT

ADMINISTRATIVE TRAFFIC OFFICER, MATTHEW SHAW



Officer, Matthew Shaw, is a born and raised “Shader” who truly cares about his community. Throughout his childhood Matthew was involved in just about every sport offered by the township of Maple Shade. He formed lifelong friendships and memories and eventually becoming the Captain of the Boys High School Varsity Soccer Team. Matthew graduated from Maple Shade High School in 2004 among the top of his class. He has always had a heart for service which eventually played a key role in his chosen profession as a Maple Shade Police Officer.

Matthew joined the Maple Shade Police Department in March 2008, graduating from the Burlington County Police Academy Class #95. As a new officer, Matthew was eager to learn and wanted to put his best foot forward in all that he did, and it showed in Matt’s performance. Very early-on in his career, he was chosen by his peers, as the “Police Officer of the Year”. This is prestigious award that recognizes an officer’s contributions to policing in the township as well as contributions to the community at large.

Matthew was assigned to the Traffic Safety Division in 2012 where he focused on improving traffic safety throughout the township, a mission he took to heart. While assigned to the traffic division, Matt went through extensive training including Basic & Advanced Traffic Investigations, Vehicular Dynamics, Crash Reconstruction, Pedestrian Crash Investigations, Scene Photography, Interviewing Techniques, Forensic Evidence Collection, and the Rutgers Traffic Engineering School for Police just to name a few.

He eventually became the department's Administrative Traffic Officer in 2017 where he became the role as the Traffic Safety Unit Supervisor. During his time as the unit supervisor, Matt focused on many traffic related improvements that increased the overall safety of our roads and crosswalks. Matthew also identified the need for pedestrian safety enhancements along Main Street. In 2019, he worked closely with Chief Fletcher, Township Manager, Susan Danson, and the Burlington County Highway Division to upgrade Main Street and Forklanding Road by improving pedestrian safety devices with a plan to expand those measures in the near future. Matthew is heavily involved in the planning, coordinating, and overall safety of all road work being conducted within the township including our State Highways.

Matt utilizes various traffic safety equipment around the township, such as our mobile sign boards, and traffic study devices or counters with an emphasis on the areas surrounding our schools and heavily traveled roadways. In addition, he enjoys working with School Resource Officer, Misty Weiss, to teach driver's education at the high school and age-appropriate safety lessons to students at Yocum School.

As a "Shader", the parks and recreation facilities have a special place in Matt's heart; therefore, the safety of these complexes is a high priority to him. This passion prompted Matt to work with Chief Fletcher in presenting to the Township Council and Township Manager a plan to address park safety. This plan included proper signage at each facility's locations to make certain that medical emergencies can be responded to with speed and accuracy.

Professionally, Matt is a current member of the New Jersey Police Traffic Officers Association where he is able to network with a large group of individuals from around the state. He has also become a resource to local agencies in the field of traffic safety & investigation and assists other agencies when called upon. Working closely with our partners at the New Jersey Department of Transportation to continue improving pedestrian travel to reduce the number of injuries and fatalities along the Route 73 corridor area, is one of Matthew's main goals.

When Matthew is not working, he spends most of his free time with his wife Dawn and their two children. Dawn and Matt are expecting a third child in June 2021. Some of Matt's favorite family memories are created on his boat where he is surrounded by water and sunshine. When Matt isn't with his family, he enjoys saltwater fishing, working on large house projects, and staying physically fit. Matt would like to thank his family for their continued support of his career and looks forward to what the future holds.
