WHEREAS, the Township, on behalf of the Maple Shade Police Department, would like to accept such funds from the BCPO and supports the Prosecutor's efforts. The Township Manager has reviewed the County's proposal and has recommended that Council enter into the proposed shared services agreement for these services.

AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR SCREW PUMP REPAIR TO REFRIGERATION AIR CONDITIONING MECHANICAL MACHINING INC, (RAMM, INC) 15 UNION HILL ROAD W. CONSHOHOCKEN, PA, IN A TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$18,750.00

WHEREAS, the Township Council has determined to provide repairs to one of the three screw pumps that convey wastewater from the head of the plant to the orbal tanks: and

WHEREAS, the Township Utility Engineer has informed the Township Council that the cost of the Repair Service will be less than the bid threshold; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-3 states that a contract, the cost of which will not exceed \$44,000.00 in a fiscal year, shall be awarded without public advertising for bids and bidding therefor, and N.J.S.A. 40A:11-3 provides that prior to the award of said contract, the municipality shall solicit quotations whenever practicable for a contract, the estimated cost of which is \$1,000.00 or more and award the contract to the entity who submitted the most advantageous quotation price and other factors considered; and

WHEREAS, the Utility Engineer has informed the Township Council that it has received one quotation for the purpose of awarding a contract for the aforementioned purpose, and has recommended that the Township Council award said contract; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer, as required by N.J.A.C. 5:30-1, has certified that there are sufficient funds available for the purpose of awarding a contract to said entity, said certification being attached hereto and made a part hereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Maple Shade, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. That the Township Council, based upon the aforementioned certificate, hereby declares that there are sufficient funds available for the aforesaid purpose, and the Township Council hereby directs that the hereinafter expenditure be charged against: C-06-216-20-007-001

2. That the Township Council, for the aforementioned reasons, awards a contract to RAMM, Inc., 15 Union Hill Road West, Conshohocken, PA (19428) for the above purpose for the amount not to exceed \$18,750.00.

3. That the Township Council hereby directs the Township Mayor and Clerk to execute any contract documents which are necessary to effectuate the terms of this Resolution and which are prepared by or reviewed by the Office of the Township Attorney.

RESOLUTION 2022-R-179

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE TOWNSHIP OF MAPLE SHADE AS A STIGMA-FREE ZONE FOR MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS

WHEREAS, Township of Maple Shade is committed to establishing the township as a Stigma-Free Zone supporting efforts for Mental Health Awareness; and

WHEREAS, the National Institute of Mental Health reports that nearly one in five or roughly 53 million Americans live with a mental illness, and 1 in 6 youth ages 6-17 experience a mental health disorder each year but only half receive treatment; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, 36.7% of students reported persistent feelings of sadness or hopelessness; nearly 19% of high school students had seriously considered attempting suicide; and

WHEREAS, suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among high school-aged youth ages 14-18; in 2018, a total of 48,344 persons of all ages died from suicide and where suicide was the 10th leading cause of death overall in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the stigma associated with the disease of mental illness is identified as the primary reason individuals fail to seek the help they need to recover from disease; and

WHEREAS, when severe mental illness goes untreated or under-treated, it can lead to alcohol or substance abuse, dropping out of school, unemployment, homelessness, or suicide; and

WHEREAS, raising awareness of mental illness is an effective way to reduce the stigma associated with the disease and encourage those who are affected to seek services and support; and

WHEREAS, Township of Maple Shade is committed to creating public interest and open dialogue about stigmas, raise awareness of the disease of mental illness and create a culture wherein residents who have the disease of mental illness feel supported by the community and feel free to seek treatment for the disease without fear of a stigma, so recovery can begin; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, Township of Maple Shade, in the County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, is hereby designated as a Stigma-Free Zone.
