

The Maple Shade Police Department reminds you to be aware of scam phone calls. Recently there has been an increase in calls to cell phones advising, "Your parents have been involved in a car accident and we need you to come to the scene". The caller then provides a location they would like you to respond to. We are unsure what the motive is to draw victims to a location. Officers generally will not request your presence at a crash scene. Please look into the call before going anywhere. Call whoever they are saying was involved in a crash or check their location. Be aware. Be safe.



# 5. SENIOR FREEZE TAX REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

The State of New Jersey began mailing 2022 Senior Freeze blue booklets in mid-February, continuing throughout the month. Please allow until mid-March for delivery before contacting the State of New Jersey. The State of New Jersey mailed PTR-1 booklets to homeowners who may qualify and preprinted PTR-2 booklets to eligible homeowners who applied last year. #### WATER & SEWER INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE

#### • Merion Lane Water Main Replacement

The water main on Merion Lane is currently being replaced by MSP Construction. The project began on February 21<sup>st</sup> and completion is expected on March 10<sup>th</sup>. Please avoid the area if possible and be mindful of the construction zone.

#### • Frederick Ave Sewer Main Replacement

The sewer main on Frederick Ave, between S Lippincott & Center, is scheduled to be replaced in March by Booth Mechanical. It is expected to take three weeks to complete. Residents will be notified prior to the project starting and detours in the area will be put in place. Please avoid the area if possible during construction and take caution around the area.

# Reminder: Save the Pipes - Don't Flush Grease & Wipes!

Did you know products that are labeled "flushable" can lead to clogs and costly repairs to our sewer infrastructure?


Just because a product is marked 'flushable', **does not mean** that it can be flushed because they do not degrade like toilet paper and can end up clogging pipes. Only toilet paper and human waste should be flushed - all other products should be properly disposed of.

When flushed, products like disinfecting wipes, 'flushable' wipes, and paper towels can cause damage to pumps, and clog sewer pipes. This can all lead to costly repairs and can negatively impact the sewer systems around your home and neighborhood. Pipes in your building and on your property can be affected, resulting in surprise repairs and costs to homeowners and business owners.

The same goes for grease. Most people assume that grease remains a liquid. However, after being flushed, the opposite happens. The grease actually forms solid clumps that can become as hard as concrete. Often, solid grease can cause significant damage to our system.

Please protect our sewer system. DON'T flush grease & wipes!
