 REGISTRATION	Required NJ MVC registration sticker	Required NJ MVC registration sticker	Required Motorcycle registration
 INSURANCE	Not required	Required liability insurance \$15k/\$30k/\$5k or \$35k/\$70k/\$25k (NJMVC rule)	Required motorcycle insurance
 HELMET	Required for all riders under 17	Required for all riders regardless of age (NJDOT/DOT approved)	DOT-approved helmet required

AGE REQUIREMENTS



UNDER 15

Cannot legally operate an e-bike on public roadways.



15 – 16 YEARS OLD

May operate only if properly licensed. Cannot operate bikes capable of 28 MPH or greater.



17+ YEARS OLD

May operate qualifying e-bikes with the proper license, registration, and insurance (where required).

REQUIRED BEFORE YOU RIDE



VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE OR REQUIRED LICENSE



NJMVC REGISTRATION STICKER (WHERE REQUIRED)



LIABILITY INSURANCE (MOTORIZED BICYCLES ONLY)



HELMET (AS REQUIRED BY LAW)



KNOW & OBEY ALL TRAFFIC LAWS

VIOLATIONS & CONSEQUENCES

- Operating an unregistered e-bike
- Unlicensed operation
- Operating without required insurance
- Failure to exhibit license, registration, or proof of insurance
- Traffic violations (stop signs, red lights, reckless operation, etc.)



VEHICLES MAY BE SUBJECT TO IMPOUNDMENT

Depending on the circumstances and department policy.
