**AUTHORIZE INTERLOCAL SHARED SERVICE AGREEMENT
BETWEEN MOORESTOWN FIRE DISTRICT #2 AND TOWNSHIP OF
MAPLE SHADE FOR FIRE PREVENTION ADMINISTRATION AND
ENFORCEMENT SERVICES**

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., permits local units of this State to enter into an agreement for the provision of any service that a party is authorized to provide within its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Fire Safety Act, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-192 et seq., and the Uniform Fire Code, N.J.A.C. 5:70, provide for the administration and enforcement of fire safety requirements through an approved Local Enforcing Agency; and

WHEREAS, Maple Shade has requested that the Moorestown Fire District No. 2, provide fire prevention administration and enforcement services, and the District has determined that it can provide those services in a manner that supports efficient and consistent enforcement of the Uniform Fire Code; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. _____ adopted _____, 20__, the Board of Commissioners of Moorestown Fire District No. 2 authorized the execution of this Agreement, and by Resolution No. 2026-R-161 adopted September 24, 2026, the Township Council of the Township of Maple Shade likewise authorized its execution; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is made by and between:

Moorestown Fire District No. 2 (the “Host Agency”), a fire district corporation of the State of New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as the “District”), having an address of 229 North Lenola Road, Moorestown, New Jersey 08057; and

The Township of Maple Shade (the “Receiving Municipality”), a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as “Maple Shade”), having an address of 200 Stiles Avenue, Maple Shade, New Jersey 08052.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. Scope of Services

The District is designated as the agent of Maple Shade for the administration and enforcement of the Uniform Fire Safety Act, the Uniform Fire Code, applicable Maple Shade fire prevention ordinances, and related fire safety requirements within Maple Shade.

The District shall provide fire prevention services customarily performed by a Local Enforcing Agency, including inspections and re-inspections, permit review and issuance, complaint investigations, fire code enforcement, fire investigations, public fire safety education, recordkeeping, reporting, and other services reasonably necessary for the administration of the Uniform Fire Code.

Maple Shade authorizes the Fire Official and qualified personnel assigned by the District to exercise the powers and perform the duties granted to a Local Enforcing Agency under applicable

law. Maple Shade shall remain responsible for its own legal services and for municipal services outside the normal scope of fire prevention and Uniform Fire Code enforcement.

2. Personnel

- A.** The District shall appoint and employ a certified Fire Official and shall be authorized and responsible for appointing, supervising, disciplining, and discharging all Fire Inspectors, administrative personnel, and other employees assigned to perform services under this Agreement.
- B.** All personnel furnished under this Agreement shall be employees of Moorestown Fire District No. 2 and shall be subject to the District's personnel policies, employment agreements, compensation practices, and benefit requirements. Nothing in this Agreement creates an employment relationship between Maple Shade and any District employee.
- C.** The District shall employ sufficient qualified personnel to carry out the terms of this Agreement. The District shall determine the number, classification, scheduling, and assignment of personnel necessary to satisfy applicable inspection, enforcement, investigation, reporting, and administrative requirements, subject to the approved annual compensation and any material staffing-cost increase approved in writing by both parties.
- D.** The Fire Official shall direct the day-to-day operations of the Local Enforcing Agency, including the supervision of assigned personnel, assignment of work, inspections, investigations, enforcement activities, permit administration, records, and reports. Maple Shade may direct public or administrative complaints concerning the program to the Township Manager, who shall coordinate with the Fire Official or the District. Employment and disciplinary decisions remain solely with the District.
- E.** All personnel performing duties that require State certification shall possess and maintain the certifications required by the State of New Jersey.

3. Location and Hours of Operation

- A.** The parties shall maintain access to office space and records necessary to administer fire prevention services for Maple Shade. The principal location for Maple Shade services shall be a location approved by the parties, and may be changed by mutual agreement without formal amendment of this Agreement.
- B.** Office availability and inspection scheduling shall be established by the Fire Official in coordination with the Maple Shade Township Manager. The hours and staffing provided shall be sufficient to reasonably accommodate the public and the operational needs of Maple Shade. The Fire Official may adjust schedules as necessary to meet workload and enforcement requirements.

4. Fee Schedule and Bank Accounts

Maple Shade shall adopt and maintain its own fire prevention fee and penalty schedules, with review and recommendations from the Fire Official as appropriate. All fees, fines, penalties, Life Hazard Use rebates, and other revenues generated from properties or activities located within

Maple Shade shall be deposited into accounts designated by Maple Shade and retained by Maple Shade, except for amounts required to be remitted to the State or otherwise directed by law.

Revenue retained by Maple Shade shall not reduce the compensation due to the District under this Agreement unless the parties agree otherwise in writing.

5. Insurance and Indemnification

- A.** By entering into this Agreement, neither party waives any immunity or defense available under the New Jersey Tort Claims Act, N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et seq., or other applicable law.
- B.** To the extent permitted by law, Maple Shade shall indemnify and hold harmless the District, its commissioners, officials, employees, and agents from claims arising from the condition of Maple Shade property, Maple Shade's acts or omissions, or enforcement actions directed or undertaken by Maple Shade, except to the extent caused by the negligence or misconduct of the District or its employees.
- C.** To the extent permitted by law, the District shall indemnify and hold harmless Maple Shade, its elected officials, employees, and agents from claims arising from the negligence or misconduct of the District or its employees in performing services under this Agreement.
- D.** The District shall maintain workers' compensation, employer's liability, automobile liability, and general liability insurance applicable to its employees and operations. Maple Shade shall not be responsible for workers' compensation, disability, employment, or similar claims made by District employees. Each party shall provide evidence of coverage upon reasonable request. Any additional-insured requirement shall be subject to the terms and availability of the applicable policy.

6. Maintenance of Records

- A.** The Fire Official and assigned personnel shall maintain records of inspections, permits, complaints, investigations, enforcement actions, and other program activity in accordance with the Uniform Fire Code, State record-retention requirements, and applicable law. Maple Shade records shall be maintained separately from District records.
- B.** Access to public records shall be governed by the Open Public Records Act and applicable records-retention requirements. Requests shall be handled by the custodian of the public agency having actual custody of the requested record, with reasonable cooperation between the parties.
- C.** Maple Shade shall provide and fund the records-management software, internet connectivity, compatible hardware, and other technology reasonably necessary to administer Maple Shade services. Hardware and licenses purchased by Maple Shade shall remain Maple Shade property unless otherwise agreed in writing. The District shall be provided the access reasonably necessary to administer the program.

7. Activities Excluded from this Agreement

The following activities are specifically excluded unless added by written agreement of the parties:

- Residential Change of Occupancy smoke and carbon monoxide certification inspections, which are administered by the Maple Shade Zoning Office;
- Zoning, land use, property maintenance, housing, and Uniform Construction Code services;
- Fire suppression, emergency medical services, rescue operations, incident command, and emergency response functions;
- CSACMAC or other services not ordinarily within the scope of the Local Enforcing Agency, unless specifically approved by both parties; and
- Any other activity not reasonably within the scope of Uniform Fire Code administration and enforcement.

Nothing in this Agreement prevents either party from providing other services that do not conflict with the services described herein.

8. Enforcement

The Fire Official shall conduct or supervise investigations and inspections and shall take appropriate enforcement action for violations of the Uniform Fire Safety Act, Uniform Fire Code, and applicable Maple Shade ordinances occurring within Maple Shade. Copies of formal Notices of Violation and other material enforcement documents shall be maintained in Maple Shade's records and made available to Maple Shade.

The Fire Official and assigned personnel shall provide evidence, documentation, and testimony reasonably necessary to support enforcement proceedings, including Municipal Court, Superior Court, administrative proceedings, and appeals.

Maple Shade shall be responsible for the cost of its municipal legal services and any separate legal action undertaken on behalf of Maple Shade. Ordinary employee time for testimony and documentation arising from work performed under this Agreement is included in the compensation paid under this Agreement unless extraordinary services are separately approved by the parties.

9. Notices and Summonses

The Fire Official and other properly authorized personnel shall have the authority to issue notices, orders, penalties, and summonses for fire code violations within Maple Shade to the extent permitted by law.

10. Reports and Meetings

The Fire Official shall furnish the Maple Shade Township Manager with monthly written reports summarizing services provided, including inspections, permits, complaints, enforcement activity, fire investigations, and other relevant program activity. The Fire Official shall be responsible for timely submission of reports required by the New Jersey Division of Fire Safety on behalf of Maple Shade, with copies provided to Maple Shade upon request.

Authorized representatives of the parties shall meet at least annually to review the scope, quality, staffing, workload, financial performance, and effectiveness of the services provided. Additional meetings may be requested by either party.

11. Compensation to the District

A. In exchange for the services described herein, Maple Shade shall pay the District \$186,500.00 annually in four (4) quarterly installments, prorated for any partial year of service.

Administrative Accounting Fee	\$1,500.00

B. The Fire Prevention Staffing Reimbursement funds the personnel reasonably necessary to provide the contracted services. The parties acknowledge that the current staffing plan anticipates part-time fire inspection personnel; however, the District may adjust the number or classification of personnel to meet workload and regulatory requirements. Any material increase in annual staffing costs beyond the approved annual amount requires written approval by both parties.

C. Quarterly payments shall be due on January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1 of each year. For the initial partial year, the first payment shall be due within thirty (30) days after the effective date, with the remaining payments adjusted proportionately.

D. The parties shall review compensation annually. Any change to the annual payment shall be approved in writing by both parties in accordance with applicable budget and governing-body requirements.

E. In addition to the annual payment, Maple Shade shall provide and fund a municipal vehicle suitable for fire prevention duties, including fuel, maintenance, insurance, and replacement; records-management software and licensing; internet and communications services; inspection tablets or comparable equipment; and other operational resources specifically approved by the parties. District employees authorized to operate a Maple Shade vehicle shall comply with applicable law and Maple Shade vehicle policies provided to the District.

12. Duration and Termination

This Agreement shall commence on _____, 20__ (the “Effective Date”) and shall remain in effect for four (5) years, ending on _____, 20__, unless terminated earlier in accordance with this section.

Each party shall notify the other in writing at least ninety (90) days before expiration if it desires to negotiate a renewal. Renewal is subject to approval by the governing bodies and any approval required by the New Jersey Division of Fire Safety or other State agency.

Either party may terminate this Agreement upon one hundred eighty (180) days’ written notice. The parties shall cooperate in the orderly transfer of records, pending permits, open enforcement matters, and other responsibilities. Maple Shade shall remain responsible for all payments and approved costs incurred through the effective date of termination, including any reasonable and documented transition costs.

13. Contracting with Private Parties

If the District uses a special inspector, private contractor, or professional entity to perform or assist with services under this Agreement, the District shall procure those services in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law and all other applicable laws and regulations. The Fire Official shall determine when specialized assistance or reassignment is necessary because of workload, expertise, or a conflict of interest.

14. Conflict of Interest

The Fire Official and all personnel assigned under this Agreement shall comply with conflict-of-interest requirements applicable to Local Enforcing Agencies, public employees, and fire code enforcement personnel. A matter involving an actual or potential conflict shall be reassigned to a qualified person or agency as determined by the Fire Official and permitted by law.

15. Entire Agreement and Amendments

This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding of the parties concerning the services described herein and supersedes prior oral or written understandings on the same subject. No amendment or modification is valid unless it is in writing and approved and executed by both parties in accordance with law.

16. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this Agreement is determined to be invalid by a court or other authority of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions, which shall continue in full force to the extent permitted by law.

17. Miscellaneous

- A.** This Agreement and the resolutions authorizing it shall be filed or submitted as required by the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, the Uniform Fire Safety Act, the Uniform Fire Code, and the New Jersey Division of Fire Safety.
- B.** Each party shall permit the other reasonable access to records relevant to this Agreement for audit, review, and program administration, subject to applicable confidentiality and public-records laws.
- C.** Notices required under this Agreement shall be in writing and delivered personally, by certified mail, or by nationally recognized overnight delivery service to the following addresses, or to another address designated in writing:
